
At the booth of Franco American aristocrat Flore de Brantes, several objects designed by her friend Hervé Van der Straeten are turning heads. Among them is the Super Bubbling mirror, number 15 of an edition of 60, its convex reflector framed in patinated bronze and studded with spheres of blue glass. It is 43.5 inches in diameter and 6.5 inches deep.



Berko Fine Paintings

French artist Jean-Gabriel Domergue, who died in 1962, was famous for brushing celebrated beauties on canvas, and at Berko's booth, one can gaze upon one of his largest examples: a portrait of Black cabaret star, movie actress, and Resistance figure Josephine Baker. Painted in oil on canvas and set within an Art Nouveau frame, it depicts Baker completely and joyously starkers, a beaming smile on her face and her arms outstretched, and is heroic in scale: 89.4 inches tall by 63.4 inches wide.
